An Introduction: The Wards 7 & 8 DC Prevention Center

DC DEPARTMENT OF BEHAVIORAL HEALTH



The Wards 7 & 8 DC Prevention Center (DCPC) is a collaborative venture with the DC Department of Behavioral Health, Substance Use Disorders (DBH SUD) division and Bridging Resources In Communities, Inc. (BRIC), the lead community based agency for this initiative, designed to reduce youth access to and use of drugs. There are four DC Prevention Centers, each covering two DC Wards.

Launched in June 2010, the Wards 7 & 8 DCPC utilizes a public health, social development model based upon the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Strategic Prevention Framework. The Wards 7 & 8 DCPC employs this framework to engage in population/community level drug use prevention that incorporates three core functions to address priority risk factors and target outcomes.

Community Education Community Leadership Community Change

Grand Opening


On June 6, 2017, the staff also supported the Check It Building Grand Opening in Ward 8 with key leaders Phil Pannell and Ron Moten.
